Anglicanism

As Anglicans, we are part of a global communion of churches established over the centuries by the Church of England. The Anglican Church is a biblically based church with ancient roots and a treasure of rich resources that help us grow as followers of Jesus Christ to love God and serve our communities as Christians.

Anglicans have always sought to worship God faithfully with living forms of worship. Therefore, our services and liturgies mirror the worship of the ancient apostolic church while incorporating the common language and culture of the communities in which they are practiced. Furthermore, Anglicans incorporate both ancient sacramental practices and visual symbols to celebrate the certainty of our faith and the mysteries of God. Together, sacrament, symbol, and word, enlivened by the Holy Spirit, connect our senses with our minds and hearts.

In order to remain true to the teachings of Christ and the apostles, Anglicans have historically upheld the Holy Scriptures as God's Word, have held to the summary of evangelical beliefs known as the Thirty-Nine Articles of Faith, and have accepted the three great Christian creeds, the Apostles' Creed, the Nicene Creed, and the Athanasian Creed, as the fundamental statements of the Christian faith. We celebrate the sacraments of baptism and the Lord's Supper as commanded by Jesus and we uphold the historic order of bishops, presbyters, and deacons in the administration of the church's life and mission.

Today the worldwide Anglican Communion is experiencing both tremendous stress and tremendous renewal. The stress comes as some provinces depart from historic Anglican faith and practices and from the orthodox understanding of the Holy Scriptures. We don't know whether this will result in a formal division of the Anglican Communion, but many commentators opine that the Anglican Communion is headed for "reorganization." We do know we support the leadership of the Anglican Diocese of South Carolina and the Anglican Church of North America as they discern the direction of our communion. We also know that renewal in the Anglican Church comes from the explosive growth of the gospel through Anglican churches and missions in many locations, particularly the "two-thirds world." Perhaps there is much we can learn from those members of the Anglican faith.

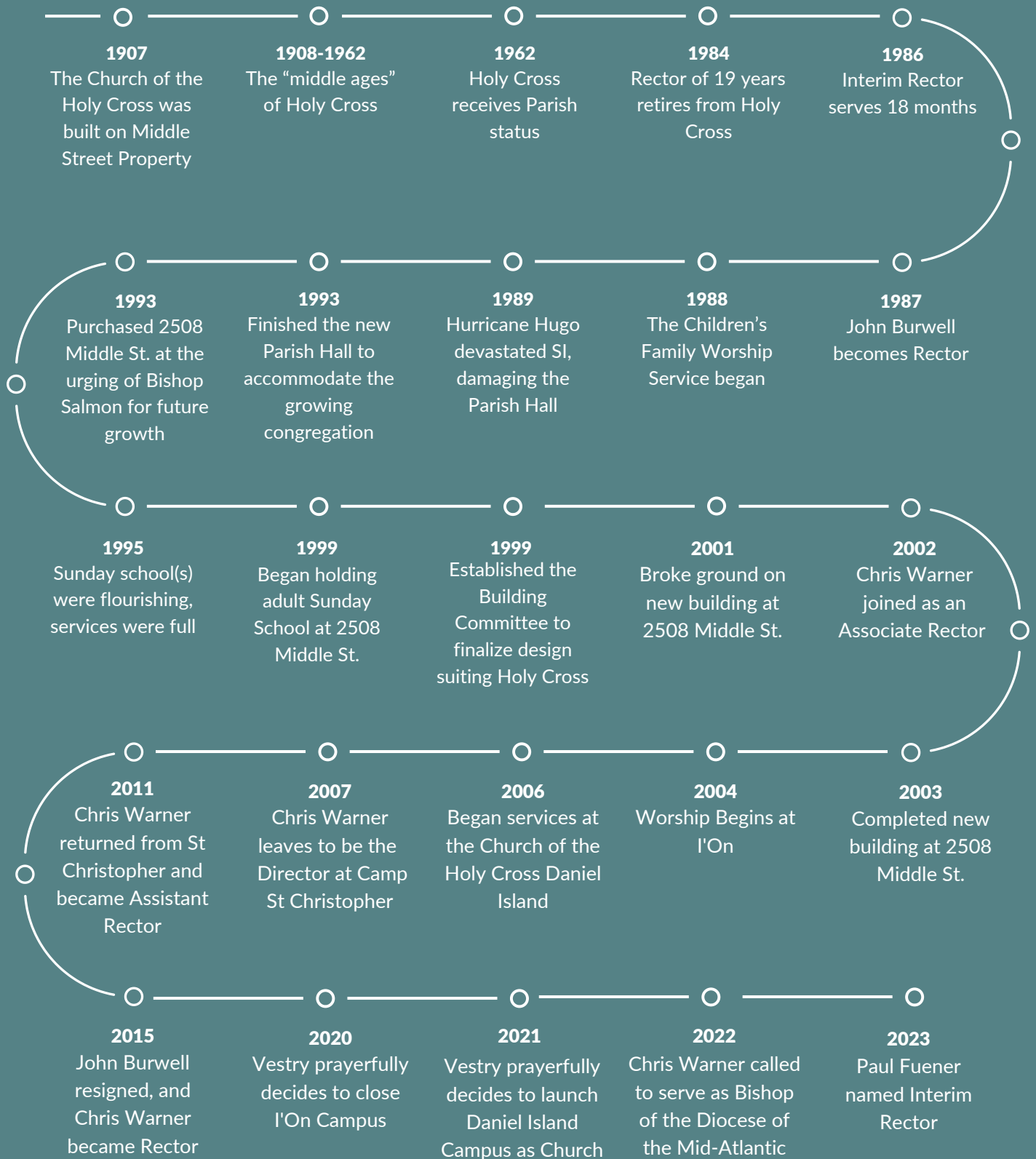
Prayers for a New Rector

For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened.” We are confident God will lead the right person to us as we pray in faith, trusting His provision.

“We lift up those who shall choose a new Rector for this Church, that we may receive a faithful pastor who will preach the Gospel, care for your people, equip us for ministry, and lead us forth in fulfillment of the Great Commission. And to all your people give your heavenly grace, especially to this Congregation, that with reverent and obedient hearts we may hear and receive your holy Word, and serve you in holiness and righteousness all the days of our lives. In the Strong Name of Jesus, Amen.”

OUR PAST



Overview

The Church of the Holy Cross has gone through significant changes over the past 20 years. Growth was the vision. Growth on Sullivan's Island through a massive building project, and growth within two new nearby communities experiencing a population explosion - Daniel Island and I'On. This two-pronged approach to growth bloomed into a vision for Holy Cross to be "one Church with multiple campuses." As it stands today, the once envisioned "one Church with multiple campuses," is no longer. In addition, our Church is grieving the loss of several long-time staff members that left in 2021/2022. God is clearly doing a new thing..."Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?" Isaiah 43:18-19a. God is leading us to let go of our old selves, so we can claim our new identity as a parish and our new leader as our Rector.

Holy Cross has had a rich history of growth with strong campus identities. During 2022, the previous Rector, Chris Warner, and the vestry prayerfully decided it was time to release the Holy Cross Daniel Island campus to become a fully separate new parish. We approached and received approval from the Bishop to begin preparations for the release and informed both campuses of the decision.

Shortly thereafter, the assistant Rector, Trevor Spencer, was called to lead a Church in Virginia and then our Rector was called to become the Bishop of the Anglican Diocese of the Mid-Atlantic. The vestry established two committees, a Rector search committee and the Daniel Island Launch Committee.



OUR PRESENT

We were fortunate to find the Reverend Paul Fuener to serve as interim Rector and we have followed the protocols established by the diocese to seek the person we believe God has already chosen to lead Holy Cross Sullivan's Island. The Daniel Island Launch Committee has also completed significant activities following the protocols established by the Diocese to become a separate new parish, targeting approval at the Diocesan Convention in March of 2024.

During this season of transition, we expect our new Rector to continue to support and oversee the process of establishing Daniel Island as a separate new parish. This anticipated separation is requiring both campuses to define with some certainty the budgetary realities of having two independent campuses while we fulfill our goal of successfully establishing Daniel Island as a separate new parish.

Presently, both campuses utilize a shared services concept (i.e., operations, finance & accounting, IT, communications, etc.) which is presently staffed from the Sullivan's Island campus. Each campus has its own school which has separate staff but follows common practices.

As we prayerfully expect Daniel Island to be independent by early 2024, our new Rector will only be responsible for supporting the final steps of formalizing the Daniel Island as a separate new parish. After formalization, the Rector will only be over Holy Cross Sullivan's Island.

Given these anticipated changes the following materials primarily include information pertaining to The Church of the Holy Cross Sullivan's Island after the release of our Daniel Island Campus.





Church of the Holy Cross at present is one Church with two campuses:
Sullivan's Island and Daniel Island.

Since our Daniel Island location is launching as a stand-alone Church, this Parish Profile will discuss the launch status of Daniel Island, but will highlight Sullivan's Island.

The Sullivan's Island Campus comprises three buildings:

- Historic Church: Completed 1907; 2,176 sq ft; seats 120; traditional interior; no projection capabilities; houses our Bell Tower.
- Traditional Church: Completed 2003; 6,048 sq ft; seats 300; traditional interior with loft area; has projection capabilities; organ; restroom.
- Parish Hall: Completed 2003; 9,064 sq ft; seats 350; contemporary beach-themed interior with vaulted ceilings; full projection capabilities; a commercial kitchen; restrooms. Houses our Contemporary Service sanctuary, main offices, and Holy Cross Island Preschool (HIS).

The Sullivan's Island Campus also comprises two parking areas with handicapped access and two playgrounds.

Holy Cross Island School

Our Mission

The mission of Holy Cross Island School (HIS School) is to provide a fun and educational place for children to grow and learn in an environment that teaches and practices the love of Jesus Christ as a ministry of the Church of the Holy Cross.

Our Certification

HIS School is a licensed faith-based preschool with South Carolina Childcare. This certification is difficult to achieve and maintain and should give parents great peace in knowing their child's preschool follows the highest standard for safety, education, and care available in the area. This distinction is established by the regulatory process within The Department of Social Services (DSS) and The Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC).

Curriculum and Enrichment

ENROLLMENT

Holy Cross Island School uses South Carolina Standards of Learning to guide our lesson planning and instruction throughout the year. These objectives come from the Math, Science, Literacy, Social/Emotional and Gross/Fine Motor skill components. Our literacy curriculum for our four classrooms is derived from Explode the Code and Learning without Tears. Spiritual Objectives are age appropriate and focus on teaching the gospel of Jesus Christ and his unfailing love for us all.

Worship at Holy Cross

Our services include Communion every Sunday.

At present, we receive Communion by intinction. The priest places a host wafer into the communicant's palm, and the communicant dips the wafer in the chalice held by a lay server. We have ushers, lay readers, and lay eucharistic ministers for most services, and acolytes or crucifers at some services.

Our services have a casual, friendly, but reverent feel to them.

Some folks "dress for Church" but many come dressed in what is typical for public wear in beach communities. We seek to be visitor welcoming: name tags are available and encouraged at our entrances, members are friendly to newcomers, in most services the liturgy, songs, and announcements are on screens, and informational materials and welcome packets are available for the taking after the service.

Our music is a combination of hymns or praise songs.

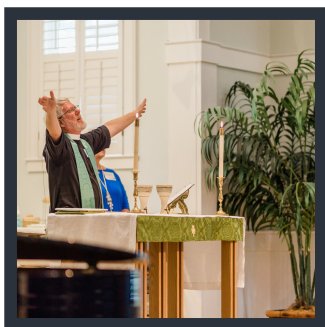
Both are winsome, well-played, and typically draw our congregations into heartfelt worship. Our musicians are not performers, but true worship leaders.

Our sermons range from 15 to 30 minutes.

Depending on the preacher and the particular service, they are uniformly biblical, orthodox, and relevant to our congregation and the culture in which we live. They welcome some humor in the sermon, and most enjoy the teaching component of the sermon, as well as its exhortation.



Our Ministries: Serve on Sunday

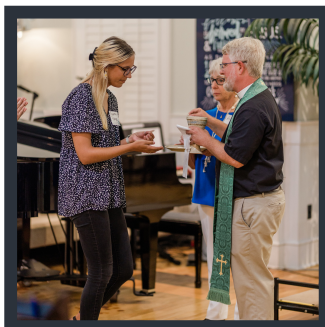


Altar Guild

Serve once every 4-6 weeks and set up the elements that we use for communion each week, appropriate hangings, and hymn numbers in the worship space.

Greeter & Usher

Welcome worshippers with a friendly face, help with directions, and collect the offering.



Layreader & Chalice Bearer

Lead in worship every 4-6 weeks through the reading of Scripture and prayers and serve the chalice.

Pre-k Ministry

Providing loving childcare for the kids at Holy Cross from 4 months- 4 years.





Praise Teams

A rotating team of vocalists and instrumentalists serving at our Contemporary worship service.

Choir

A traditional choir leading music at our 11 AM service.



Media Team

Produce sound and screens for the Contemporary service and special events.



Photo or Video

Document events at Holy Cross and create media for promotional use.



Cooking Team

Help prepare food for our campuses or local ministry partners.





Children and Families

CHILDREN'S FAMILY SERVICE: Each Sunday morning we spend time worshipping, creatively exploring the Bible, and engaging as families in meaningful activities.

PRE-K MINISTRIES: Pre-K Ministries (4 months - 4 years) meets on to worship, hear a Bible story, and engage in fun activities.

KIDS CLUB: This summertime day camp for kids 1 year - 1st grade emphasizes Biblical themes while packing the maximum amount of fun into every day.

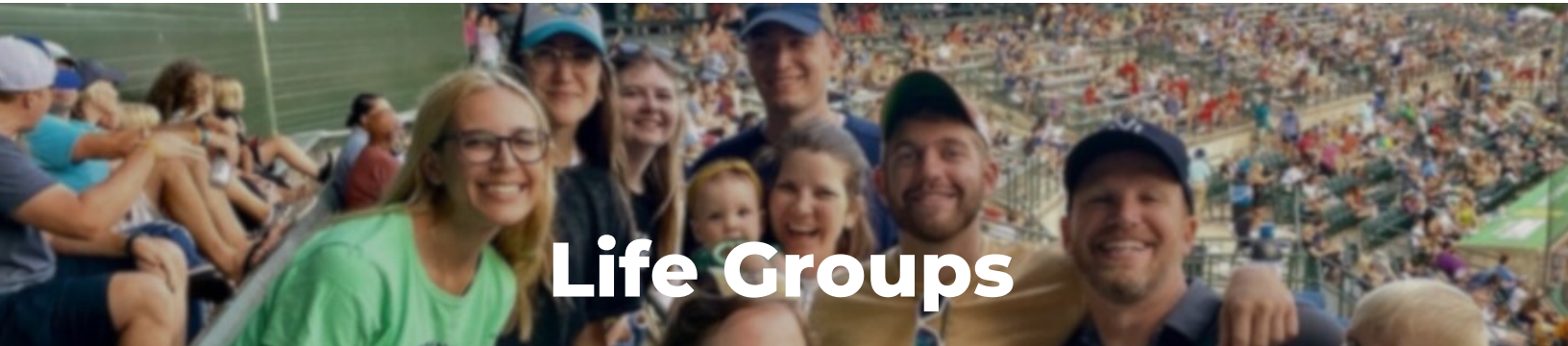


Students

PRAYER CHAMPIONS: At Holy Cross, we have the awesome privilege to care for the souls of the next generation. Our prayer champions pray over a student for the school year.



Life Groups

At Holy Cross, Life Groups aren't just what we do, it's who we are. For us, doing life together is far more than a catchphrase – it's a biblical conviction. We believe that God never meant for us to do life alone. We were created to walk with each other, to grow with one another, and to glorify God together.



Adults

MEN'S MINISTRY: Our Men's Ministry seeks opportunities for adventure, growth, and service beyond Life Groups. Activities vary year by year but generally, we have a Men's Retreat in the fall and a Men's Hike in the mountains in the spring both of which provide places and relationships that help us grow in our life in Christ.

WOMEN'S MINISTRY: Currently, our Women's Ministry has no designated leader, but previously was centered around relationships with each other and with Jesus. Activities varied year by year, but we generally had a spring Women's Retreat as well as Women's Gatherings throughout the year.

SENIORS MINISTRY 60+: Our Prime Timers are a valued and respected part of the Holy Cross Family. We are always planning activities of fellowship, fun, education, and worship to celebrate their important place here.

Our Classes



DISCOVERING MEMBERSHIP

Holy Cross loves and welcomes new members. Being connected to Jesus and to His family here at Holy Cross begins with becoming plugged in. Our Newcomers' Dinners helps people get to know folks in the Church and some of our leadership.

THEOLOGY ON TAP

This is an informal gathering at New Realm Brewing on Daniel Island. This time is a chance to hear a relevant talk on a difficult topic, and then to follow up with questions.

GRIEFSHARE AT HOLY CROSS

This is a place for those in grief to find encouragement and help in grieving the death of a loved one.

LENTEN TEACHING SERIES

This is a time of musical worship, teaching, and discussion. This series is offered for 4-5 Wednesday evenings during Lent.

Prayer and Care

“Are any of you suffering hardships? You should pray. Are any of you happy? You should sing praises. Are any of you sick? You should call for the elders of the Church to come and pray over you. Such a prayer offered in faith will heal the sick, and the Lord will make you well. And if you have committed any sins, you will be forgiven. Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The earnest prayer of a righteous person has great power and produces wonderful results.”
(James 5:13-15)



We believe that prayer is one of the pillars of our faith and our Church and we strive to pray for one another in our Life Groups, in our Sunday morning prayer time, and as individuals casually gather. We do aspire to grow more in the knowledge and practice of prayer.

We previously offered various types of healing prayer ministry through Community Healing Services, private healing prayer appointments, and soaking prayer sessions. Some of our congregants trained under Christian Healing Ministries in Jacksonville, FL. More recently, we saw a need for Sunday Morning Prayer ministry during Communion at our contemporary service for those who desire brief prayer with our team.

With the exception of Sunday Morning Prayer, the prayer ministry at Holy Cross has gradually diminished. This decrease is mainly due to a lack of anyone volunteering to take on a directorial role in the ministry. Additionally, in the past, it has been a challenge to have consistent clergy oversight for this ministry. Our hope is that we can reinvigorate the prayer ministry with help from our clergy and a new volunteer director.



EAST COOPER COMMUNITY OUTREACH: Throughout the year Holy Cross collects food for a local food pantry that provides groceries to those caught in poverty. Through special collection Sundays at both campuses and a permanent collection bin on the back porch at Holy Cross Daniel Island we collect tons of food each year to help those in need.

MEN'S TURKEY FRY: We feed our hungry neighbors at Christmas. We fry turkeys on the morning of Christmas Eve.

ADDITIONAL COMMUNITY OUTREACH: Blessings Box, Fix-It, Hurricane Relief, KAIROS Prison Ministry, and Cooking Ministry.



International Missions

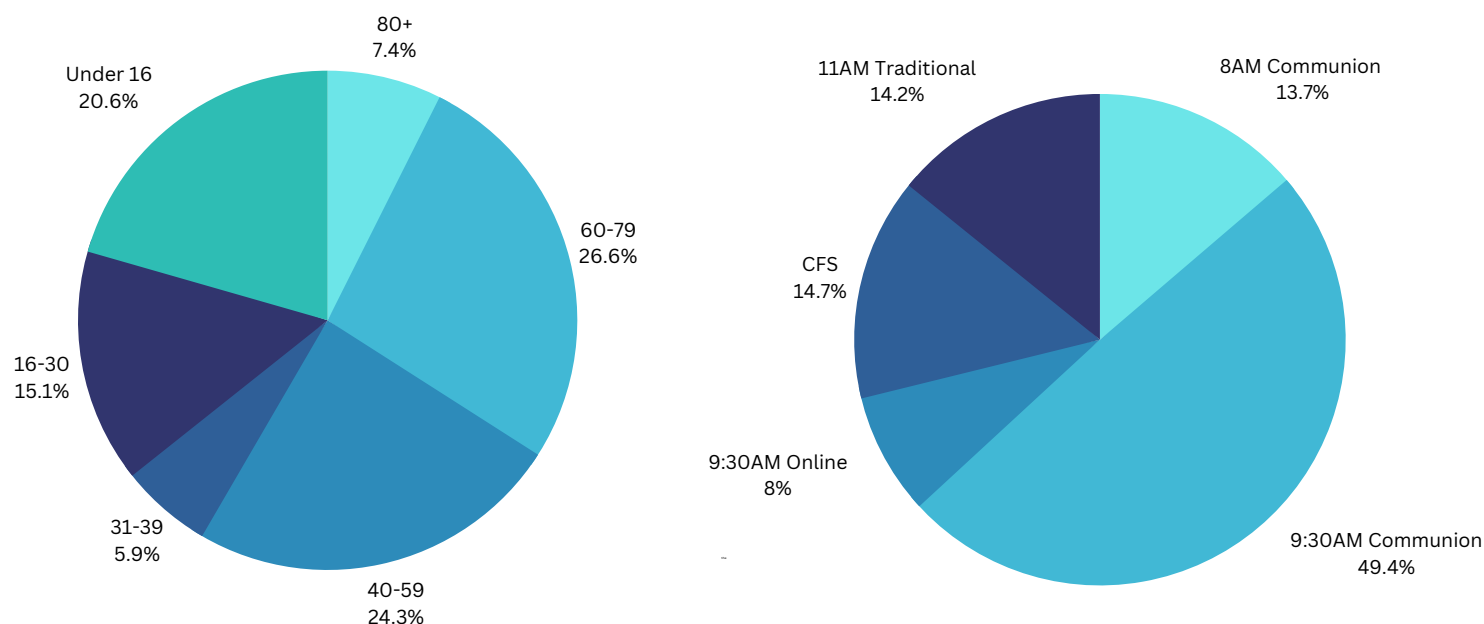

OUR MINISTRY PARTNERS: Honduras, India, Pakistan, Mexico, and Tanzania.

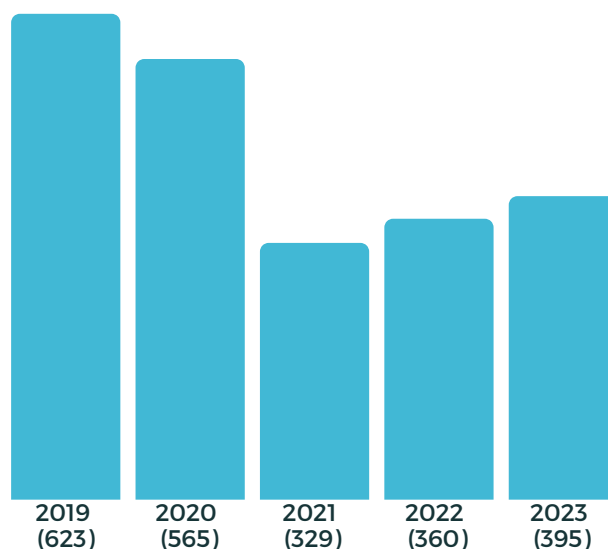
By The Numbers

Sullivans Island, Isle of Palms, and Mt Pleasant are all growing suburbs of Charleston. In addition to Sullivan's Island, both Isle of Palms (2-5 miles north of the SI Campus) and Mt Pleasant (3-10 miles northwest of the SI campus) is where our membership resides.

Two Campuses Average Sunday Attendance



Holy Cross Sullivan’s Island financials have remained strong during the pandemic despite a drop in physical attendance. Our total debt of \$2.0 million has dropped considerably from the initial loan of [\$7.7 million] in 2005 which was used to greatly expand the Sullivans Island campus while building the entirety of the Daniel Island campus. With God’s help, we desire to eliminate this debt in the next 12 months.

The following financials reflect only the Sullivan's Island campus and only portray 2024 on a stand-alone basis. During 2024 there will be services allocated to and paid for by Daniel Island.

Our Church model inclusive of the school allows us to smooth the seasonality in traditional Church revenue. For example, when Church revenue is typically lower in the 1st quarter and 3rd quarter of a year is when deposits are collected for the school thereby smoothing cash flows.

The following reflects a 2024 forecast for the Church assuming the full split of the campuses.

This forecast and the preliminary agreement on how the debt would be split should allow for a break even cash flow for the Church.

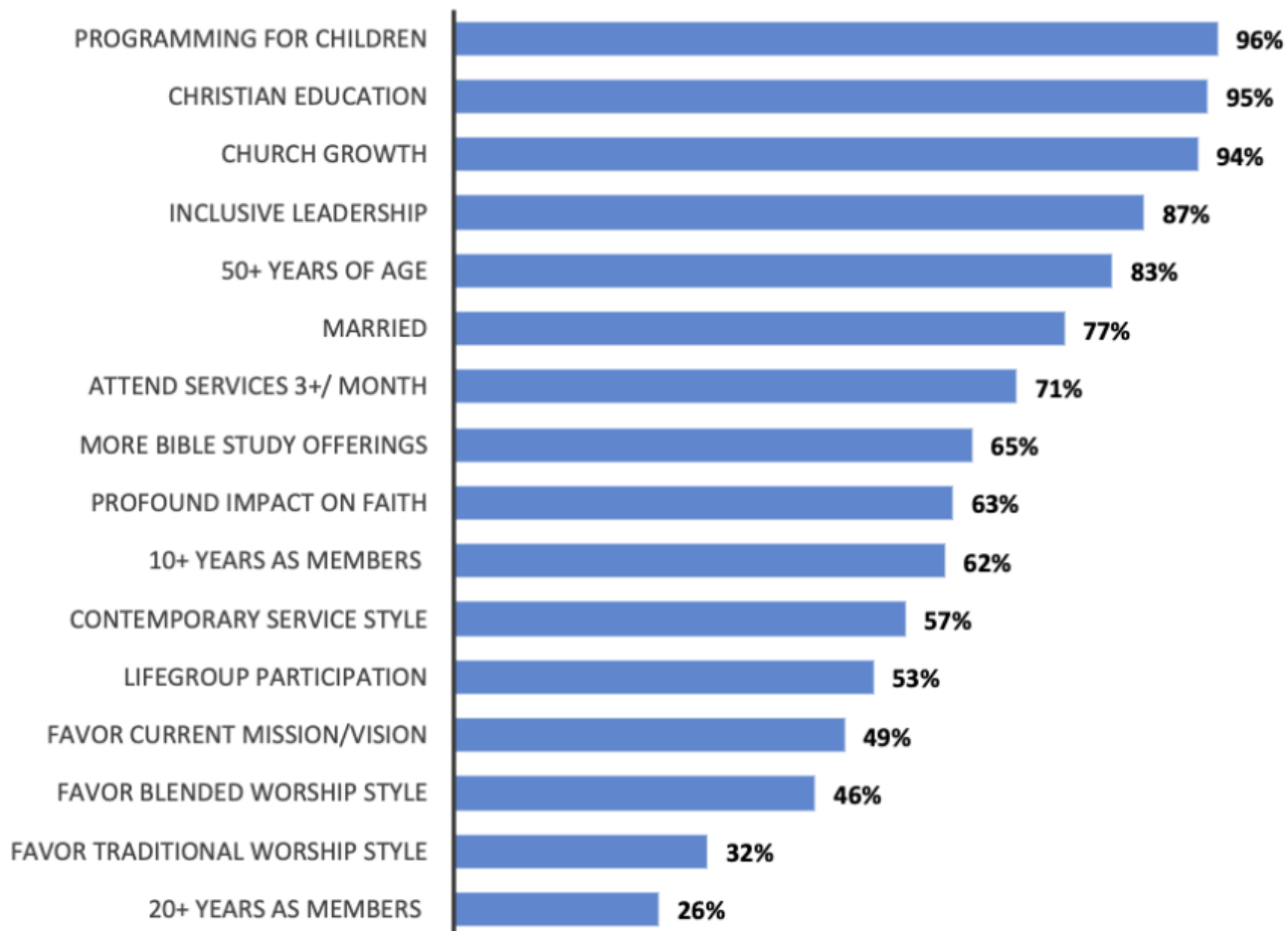
We look forward to a new Rector leading this Church to return this parish to a positive growth trend in terms of population, pledges, and tithing.

From The Congregation

A parish-wide survey was conducted over a six-week period to determine the demographics and spiritual life of the congregation, as well as the future hopes concerning the mission/vision, growth, and Christian education opportunities of the Church.

Participation was overwhelming, with 162 responses from the congregation! In addition, follow-up questions were asked at Listening Sunday, where face-to-face conversations were held about the future of the church and the type of Rector desired. The bar chart below reflects either the percent of respondents who favored greater emphasis on the subject matter, or the percent of respondents who fit into the particular category.

Listening Sunday Themes

- Desire to bring back Sunday School, weekly Bible Study teachings outside of Life Groups, and other church-wide offerings.
- Desire to see more young families join the church. Sunday school offerings, youth programs, and family-fun activities are suggestions for strategies.
- Most favor the current mission/vision but some believe a fresh approach, prayerfully developed and Spirit-led is needed.
- Not all are comfortable with the Life Group strategy. Some believe the approach may detract from the synergy of the overall congregation, forming what appear to some to be exclusive cliques. Others found Life Groups to be wonderful sanctuaries, a way to go deeper within an intimate setting.
- Would like to see a greater emphasis on local mission efforts.

Rector Search

Holy Cross is a parish longing to step more fully into the identity that Christ has for His Church. We believe the Lord has a specific identity and purpose for each Church body He forms. For the last several years, we defined our purpose as following the Great Commission and “to make disciples who make disciples of Jesus.” We followed this mission by focusing heavily on disciplining others almost exclusively through life groups. While we believed this was the assignment of our Church, by many measures, we have not achieved great success in fulfilling it.

Our membership has decreased significantly and consistently since before COVID. Does this mean we have been wrong in how we disciple others? Or does it mean we should broaden our approach to draw those into deeper water outside of just focusing on Life Groups? We are open to hearing a new assignment if that is God’s will. Jesus says, “I am the vine, and my Father is the gardener. He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit, He prunes so that it will be even more fruitful,” John 15:1-2. Whatever may be our unique assignment as a body of the Church of the Holy Cross, **we are seeking a Rector who will lead and guide us to be fruitful for the Kingdom of God. We believe the following ingredients are key to the success of a bountiful harvest for the Lord at Holy Cross: cultivating a personal love relationship with God, building the Church through spiritual formation, ushering in a Spirit of unity and truth, and cultivating an openness to the power, fruit, and gifts of the Holy Spirit.**

Jesus says, “By this, everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another,” John 13:35. Jesus is speaking of a people, a Church, that walk so closely with God that the world comes to know Him through their love, through their witness. This personal, intimate love relationship with God is foundational to what we want to become at Holy Cross. We long to be transformed! (Romans 12:2) We long to allow the Spirit’s presence and activity to work among us so that those in our community, in our workplaces, and in our lives will be drawn to Christ. We desire more outreach, evangelism, and service to the islands and local communities where we live. **We are seeking a Rector who will model, teach, and help us experience God’s love so that we can, in turn, love and serve Him with all our hearts and in the power and gifts of the Holy Spirit.**

Our hope is to grow, not just in Sunday attendance. We desire personally to grow deeper in knowledge, experience, and intimacy with Christ. According to our parish-wide survey and Listening Sunday feedback, Holy Cross is hungry for richer spiritual formation. This may be done through reigniting various developmental teachings such as Sunday School, Bible Studies, Healing and Intercessory Prayer training, Spiritual retreats, and other programs that have been cut back over the years. The hope is that by bringing the body together in community with one another and with Christ as the head, we will become better equipped to hear from God about His will, see Him at work, and join Him in the work He has prepared for us to do. **We are seeking a Rector who will help us discern God's plan for building the Church through spiritual formation.**

We desire unity. Jesus said, "I pray that all of them may be one, Father, just as you are in me, and I am in you. May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me," John 17:21. So much has changed recently at Holy Cross. Some dear leaders and friends have been called away, others left disgruntled, and some have just not returned to Church since COVID. In addition, the variety of worship services and styles has unintentionally left our Church feeling disconnected. Add in the launch of the Daniel Island campus, and it all contributes to a feeling of drastic change and separateness. We want to be unified, connected, and made into a community of all ages and preferences, yet keeping true to the firm foundation of Scripture as the source of our unification. **We are seeking a Rector who will usher in a wave of unity and fellowship among the whole body so that we can function collectively as one, just as Christ and the Father are one.**

Finally, we desire to teach our children and grandchildren about the goodness of God; to pass along our experiences and testimonies of His faithfulness and power in our lives. Immediately after giving the Great Commandment, Scripture tells us to "teach them diligently to your children," Deuteronomy 6:7. Children, youth, and young adults, therefore, must be a part of our growth plan if we are to pass down the faith to the next generation, building up the Kingdom. **We are seeking a Rector to make this population a priority in the Church, to come alongside parents and grandparents, collectively providing understanding, encouragement, assistance, and tools for shepherding our young people toward a life lived for Christ.**

All of the above-noted desires for our next Rector depend upon certain obvious or basic character traits which we feel are vitally important in the priest who will lead us: 1) A deep love for God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit as seen in their personal devotional life, public and private. 2) A full, balanced knowledge of respect for, and adherence to, Holy Scripture. 3) Integrity, honesty, and consistency. 4) A strong desire to listen, to learn who we are, to love us, and then to lead us. 5) Godly humility, as apparent in their openness to the Lord's leading and in a collaborative leadership style.
